

Architect Sou Fujimoto and Liget Budapest Project reveal **the House of Music in Hungary**, a striking cultural landmark with a nature-inspired roof. Located within Budapest's green City Park, the venue's volume formation references trees and the natural canopy of foliage and forests. A range of renewable energy strategies, such as geothermal sources, create strong eco credentials for the new House of Music, which was designed around respectful, sustainable architecture principles. Some 100 holes of various sizes perforate the roof, connecting this building to its natural surroundings in more ways than one, allowing air and light to enter the building and filter through to the ground floor in a pleasant, semi-open architectural arrangement.
