



The Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church, which was destroyed in the 11/9/2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York, reopened to the public in December 2022, after twenty-two years, due to financial setbacks and construction delays. The church designed by Santiago Calatrava and developed by The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, sits atop Liberty Park by the intersection of Greenwich and Liberty Streets. Saint Nicholas, which is also a shrine dedicated to the victims of the attacks, has just resumed usual services and parish life after undergoing a massive reconstruction.
